FACT SHEET

The <u>Northwest Career Colleges Idaho</u> was established in 2018 following an affiliation with the Northwest Career Colleges Federation of Washington for nearly 20 years. NCCI believes that career education is essential to the region's economy; career schools have been active in providing Idahoans training for the workplace since the early 1900s. These numbers have grown significantly as the need to keep up with technology and the need for educational options for non-traditional students has increased. The graduates from our schools have had a huge impact by entering the job market with valuable skills, training, and education attained from attending our member schools.

MEMBER SCHOOLS

Accredited NCCI schools are required to track and report program graduation and subsequent employment in a training related field of their students. Below are the member schools and their 2018-2019 graduation, licensure, and placement rates along with a link to each website:

EMPLOYMENT

NCCI member schools meet with industry experts and employers to ensure their programs meet the necessary outcomes for gainful employment, program relevance, licensure, and quality facilities. When industries recommend changes, these changes are evaluated and implemented to ensure benchmarks remain at or above industry standard.

TYPES OF TRAINING PROVIDED

NCCI member schools have a broad array of training opportunities that prepare Idahoans for successful completion of skill specific training (not all training results in certification),

certifications, professional licensure, associate and bachelor degrees. Training includes: electrical and telecommunications lineworker, respiratory therapy, technology, cosmetology, esthetics, nail tech, barbering, and massage therapy. Career schools provide hands-on, skill based education for training in relevant career fields. Training can be as short as 7 weeks or as long as 36 months.

SCHOLARSHIP ASSISTANCE

NCCI promotes the Careers That Work! Scholarship program for graduating high school seniors. Forty-two (42) \$1000 scholarships were awarded by Idaho high school counselors in 2020.
